

Probably something you never think about except at the table...I recently had an opportunity to visit a friend who is a farmer and Harley rider; as we spoke on the deck, we talked allot about this year's summer riding season and how it had gone so fast.

My friend was going to begin harvesting his crops very soon. Thinking a bit, we walked out to look at his driers and silos which were full and I look



toward the ground to see these specs on the surface of the asphalt. They were hard as a rock and round like ball bearings; it happened to be

a mixture of soy beans and corn and they were in little piles. He chuckled a bit and said as he grew up his father had loaded this mixture in shotgun shells and brought small game down.

As inquisitive as I am, I asked how much he loses on the highway in route to his farm...he then replied a couple gallons at least. This gives thought to what can it feel like to drive a 2-wheel vehicle over 2 gallons of ball bearings.

I tell this story as the Harvest season begins so that everyone will start to watch for those farm vehicle orange triangles and remember the dropping from some of this equipment can be very dangerous due to hardness and or in some cases from the liquidity/slick chaff. We all know how much we enjoy the back roads and those roads are full of equipment pre-positioning to begin the harvest. Most of the equipment which is involved in harvest has a maximum speed of 20 MPH but as a general rule go about 15 MPH plus most do not have chase or lead vehicles. Use caution all year around but particularly in rural areas this time of year.

Drive safely with farm machinery on the roads.

Two Directors


Eligibility for nomination includes; dues paid, attend a combination of 5 meetings/events per year, GRASS attended within the last 3 years, service on the Board or on a committee. In addition to the incumbents, members eligible for nomination to run for President, Vice President, or director, subject to their acceptance will be published after the 30 Oct due date for dues. At that time we ask that nominations be received by a serving Board member by 15 November 2015.

Please be cautious of candidates who violate Club policy of no campaigning or who try to influence voting. That kind of lack of integrity will only result in a negative impact on one of the finest Clubs in this area....Top Cats – Illinois.



VOTING. To be eligible to vote...by 30 November each year each Top Cat must have been a member in good standing for one year, attend GRASS within the first year of membership and within the past three years thereafter, and attend a combination of 5 meetings/events per year.

The Board can waive certain requirements on an individual basis for unforeseen hardships or circumstances.

Harley-Davidson Custom Vehicle Operations: Harley-Davidson Custom Vehicle Operations (CVO) models combine prestige and performance in three limited-edition factory-custom motorcycles for 2017. The CVO Limited and CVO Street

Glide models feature the refined performance of the new Twin-Cooled Milwaukee-Eight 114 engine, while the CVO Pro Street Breakout motorcycle is powered by the Screamin' Eagle Twin Cam 110B air-cooled V-Twin engine.

[Harley-Davidson, EPA reach settlement](#)

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ) announced a settlement with Harley-Davidson, Inc., that requires the companies to stop selling and to buy back and destroy illegal devices that increase air pollution from their motorcycles, and to sell only models of these devices that are certified to meet Clean Air Act emissions standards. Harley-Davidson will also pay a \$12 million civil penalty and spend \$3 million to mitigate air pollution through a project to replace conventional woodstoves with cleaner-burning stoves in local communities.

The government's complaint, filed along with the settlement, alleges that Harley-Davidson manufactured and sold approximately 340,000 illegal devices, known as "super tuners," that, once installed, caused motorcycles to emit higher amounts of certain air pollutants than what the company certified to EPA. Aftermarket defeat devices like these super tuners alter a motor vehicle's emissions controls and are prohibited under the Clean Air Act for use on vehicles that have been certified to meet EPA emissions standards. Harley-Davidson also made and sold more than 12,000 motorcycles that were not covered by an EPA certification that ensures a vehicle meets federal clean air standards.

"This settlement immediately stops the sale of illegal aftermarket defeat devices used on public roads that threaten the air we breathe," said Cynthia Giles, assistant administrator for EPA's Office of Enforcement and Compliance Assurance. "Harley-Davidson is taking important steps to buy back the 'super tuners' from their dealers and destroy them, while funding projects to mitigate the pollution they caused."

Since January 2008, Harley-Davidson has manufactured and sold two types of tuners, which when hooked up to Harley-Davidson motorcycles, allow users to modify certain aspects of a motorcycle's emissions control system. These modified settings increase power and performance, but also increase the motorcycles' emissions of hydrocarbons and nitrogen oxides (NOx). These tuners have been sold at Harley-Davidson dealerships across the country.

Harley-Davidson released its own press release of the settlement, read below for more information:

Harley-Davidson, Inc. (NYSE:HOG) has reached a settlement with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regarding the sale of one aftermarket tuning product used to calibrate motorcycles intended for off-road and closed-course competition. As part of the settlement agreement, the company will no longer sell its competition-only tuner in the U.S. The company will continue to sell a performance tuner designed to ensure Harley-Davidson motorcycles retain 50-state and EPA on-road emissions compliance. The settlement has no impact on the company's other performance product offerings.

The EPA alleged that by selling its Pro Super Tuner through its U.S. dealer network, Harley-Davidson enabled dealers and customers to tamper with motorcycles used on public roads. Harley-Davidson disagrees with the EPA's position, noting that the tuner was designed and sold as an after-market, competition-only product used to adapt engine parameters for use with Harley-Davidson after-market equipment.

"This settlement is not an admission of liability but instead represents a good faith compromise with the EPA on areas of law we interpret differently, particularly EPA's assertion that it is illegal for anyone to modify a certified vehicle even if it will be used solely for off-road/closed-course competition," said Ed Moreland, Harley-Davidson's Government Affairs Director. "For more than two decades, we have sold this product under an accepted regulatory approach that permitted the sale of competition-only parts. In our view, it is and was legal to use in race conditions in the U.S."

Harley-Davidson, one of many suppliers in the aftermarket performance parts industry, has safeguards in place to educate dealers and customers on the implications of installing Harley-Davidson performance products on their Harley-Davidson motorcycles. This includes clear product labeling of competition-only products and detail on what performance enhancements are considered street legal and for competition-use only, the legal consequences of tampering

with emission controls and components, and what enhancements would void the vehicle warranty.

"Concern for our U.S. customers and dealers weighed heavily in reaching this compromise with the EPA," said Moreland. "By settling this matter, we can focus our future attention and resources on product innovation rather than a prolonged legal battle with the EPA."

Harley-Davidson is and has been committed to meeting or exceeding all emissions requirements for its motorcycles in every market it serves. It will continue to offer a broad range of industry-leading, compliant performance products that enable customization and performance enhancements that meet all emissions requirements and maintain the company's vehicle warranty.

Sauk Prairie Harley Davidson to close in September

For 37 years bikers parked their Harleys in front Sauk Prairie's Harley Davidson dealership. For nearly 30 of those years, Crystal Mundt, the current general manager, watched the business grow. "I think probably the biggest thing is sadness," she said. "Being here every day, it's going to be tough."

By the end of next month, the dealership in Sauk City will be gone. The owner, Virgil Schulenburg says the crew will merge with the one at the location in Madison on Millpond Road. However, for the employees at the closing business, Mundt says they'll miss the entire community most.

"The transition is going to take a little bit of time, as you can imagine. 30-plus years of inventory and paperwork and fixtures -- it will all take a while to move that product out but we have a plan in place," she explained.

Still, even with the move to Madison, Mundt says Sauk Prairie will always be home.

The dealership will continue everyday operations until September 30 at 8p.m. Mundt says it has always been the owner's dream to have a dealership in Madison.

Every employee was given the opportunity to continue working at the Madison location, according to the company.

His motorcycle's totaled, but he's fine, thanks to high-tech gear

It was late in the afternoon on July 29, a Friday, when Jim took off from their home in Miltona and headed down

Minnesota 29 on his motorcycle.

The 74-year-old had gone less than two miles, to the intersection of County Road 5, when a vehicle pulled out in front of him. "I hit the front of the car and apparently, I went flying," Rasmussen said.

When Miltona Fire Department assistant chief and a first responder Kyle Grinager heard his pager go off alerting him to a motorcycle crash, he immediately started "... this was going to be a bad, ugly deal," Grinager said. "I was expecting to see a mangled, bloody mess."

However, Grinager was in for a surprise. "I walked up to him (Rasmussen) lying on the ground and he was talking," he said. "He was telling us he was OK. There was no blood. I thought, this just isn't right."

Grinager he saw a tethered cord and asked Rasmussen what it was. Rasmussen told him it was his vest — a Helite airbag vest. When Rasmussen was thrown, a cord tethered to the Can Am motorcycle instantly inflated air pockets in the vest, breaking his fall and stabilizing his neck and head, which was covered by a helmet.

"It was crazy. After a complete T-bone crash and being thrown 12 to 15 feet in the air, I thought there was no way he could have survived," Grinager said.


Rasmussen doesn't remember exactly what happened. All he knows is that a car pulled out and he hit his brakes; the next thing he remembers, faces from the Milona first responders were staring down at him.

Whenever they ride, the Rasmussens are fully outfitted in specific motorcycle gear including helmet, jacket, pants, gloves and boots that Jim says "won't fall off." The pants and jackets are made of special material that they noted is like Kevlar. It is breathable and stiff, designed specifically for motorcyclists. It is a heavier material than the leather gear usually associated with motorcycle riders.

While at the national BMW rally, the Rasmussens bought the Helite airbag vests — one for each of them. Rasmussen thought they were a bit expensive, but his wife thought.

After the crash, both Jim and Jaque really believe in the worth of their gear. "We have always had gear on," said Jim. "It's hideously expensive, but definitely worth it."

Jim said that although he spent the night in the hospital, he basically "walked away" from the crash, something he believes wouldn't have happened had he not been wearing the protective clothing. He did end up with a broken wrist and a concussion and must follow up with a neurologist.

As for his gear, Jim said the back of his helmet was slightly crushed and scratched and there were two very small scrapes on his clothing — one on his pants and another on a vest pocket. His Can Am motorcycle, however, was

totaled. As for when he'll get a new one, Jim isn't so sure.

The Helite vest provides a rigid neck brace, as well as firm support to the spine and back, chest, rib and kidneys and also provides hip and pelvic protection. The vest can be tethered to the handlebars of a motorcycle. Upon activation, a spring-loaded piston pierces the CO2 cartridge on the front of the vest and rapidly inflates the airbag around the neck and body. The air chambers are designed to stabilize the neck, spine and torso, reducing the impact to vital organs. Once the vest is deployed, it stays inflated for about 15 TO 20 seconds, then deflates. Once the used CO2 cartridge is replaced with a new one, the vest is ready to be used again.

Harley-Davidson recalls 27K bikes

Harley-Davidson has issued a recall on 27,232 model year 2016 motorcycles. In the affected motorcycles, the clutch master cylinder may lose the ability to generate enough lift to disengage the clutch, especially if the motorcycle has been parked for an extended period of time. When the engine is running and the motorcycle is in gear, if the clutch cannot be fully disengaged, the motorcycle may move unexpectedly, increasing the risk of a crash.

The affected motorcycles include certain model year 2016 Electric Glide Ultra Classic (FLHTCU), Electra Glide Ultra Classic Low (FLHTCUL), Ultra Limited Low (FLHTKL), Ultra Limited (FLHTK), CVO Street Glide (FLHXSE), Street Glide (FLHX), Street Glide Special (FLHXS), Road Glide Special (FLTRXS), Road Glide (FLTRX), Police Electra Glide (FLHTP), Road Glide Ultra (FLTRU), Fat Boy S (FLSTFBS), Softail Slim S (FLSS), and CVO Softail Pro Street Breakout (FXSE) motorcycles.

Harley-Davidson will notify owners, and dealers will inspect the clutch master cylinder for the presence of gas in the fluid, if so, the dealer will flush the clutch system and rebuild the clutch master cylinder, free of charge. The recall began July 25, 2016. Owners may contact Harley-Davidson customer service at 800/258-2464. 

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

The club turns 15 in 2010. Many of our legacy members have or will be moving on. We want to capture their and others' stories of our humble beginnings as well as favorite tales of the road.


