Jack Daniel's limited edition Indian Scout sells out in minutes



The Indian Limited is the stripped-down version of the fulldress touring bike. Indian Motorcycle

Indian Motorcycle and Jack Daniel's, along with Klock Werks Kustom Cycles, announced the 2018 Jack Daniel's Limited Edition Indian Scout Bobber reached its pre-order capacity of 177. Indian Motorcycle dealers began accepting orders on March 13 at 12 p.m. EST but were soon sold out in less than 10 minutes. Bike #001 remains available, though, as Indian Motorcycle and Jack Daniel's are hosting a sweepstakes for firefighters and EMS first responders.

The new limited-edition offering is the latest collaboration between America's first motorcycle company and America's first registered distillery. In 2016, celebrating 150 years of Jack Daniel's Tennessee Whiskey, the collaboration produced and sold out of 150 Jack Daniel's Limited Edition Indian Springfield and Indian Chief Vintage motorcycles in eight hours.

We are ecstatic that the Limited-Edition Scout Bobber sold out in less than 10 minutes," said Steve Menneto, president, Indian Motorcycle. "As cool as these bikes are, we cannot forget the important message each carries. It's the primary reason this relationship was formed, and that's to spread the word that 'Bottles & Throttles Don't Mix."



As the only distillery in the world with its own fire brigade, the Jack Daniel's Limited Edition Indian Scout Bobber drew inspiration from the brigade's gold and black firetrucks.

Each of the 177 individually-numbered motorcycles are accented with Jack Daniel's Fire Brigade themes. The bike has subtle two-tone matte black paint, a first for Indian Motorcycle, and is covered in real 24-karat gold graphics on the tank and fenders. The 24-karat gold carries through to the Fire Brigade emblem on the tank and the "Bottles and Throttles Don't Mix" emblem on the front fender.

Other custom details include a perforated genuine leather seat with "Jack Daniel's" embroidery and custom grips, pegs, and shift levers inspired by the "Old No. 7 Brand." The bike features premium gloss black finishes on the fender struts, hand control levers, engine valve covers, and exhaust tips, while a gold colored Indian Scout badge further showcases the attention to detail given in the design of this limited-edition bike. Also unique is a one-of-a-kind Montana Silversmith badge that's individually numbered and coated with real 24-karat gold.

Only 177 Jack Daniel's Limited Edition Indian Scout Bobbers were available across the globe, each coming with a com-



memorative fireman's axe, which will be engraved with each owner's name, motorcycle number (#001-#177) and VIN. Pricing starts at \$16,999 in the U.S. and \$20,999 in Canada. Each also comes with a two-year unlimited mileage factory warranty and free membership in the Indian Motorcycle Riders GroupTM for one year. Each bike will be built to order with delivery starting in August 2018.

Report: Millennial Motorcycle Buyers Aren't Interested in Harley-Davidsons

Harley-Davidson is still the number one name when it comes to motorcycles. As you can tell from the pie charts, which are based on Massachusetts and Pennsylvania VIO data from 2011 to 2016, no other brand comes close – not even by a long shot.



What is the cause of Harley-Davidson's woes? Here are two critical factors to consider: the

lack of millennial motorcycle buyers interested in their products, and the dwindling number of boomers still buying new motorcycles.

For decades, Baby Boomers comprised nearly 40% of the American population and bought Harley-Davidsons in droves. Now,



though? Millennials outnumber them and won't spend money on hogs.

Furthermore, the distribution of Harley-Davidson dealers does not reflect the currently shifting trends in population density, which will lead to problems for them down the road. More and more people are moving to cities, millennials especially.

Younger generations don't think Harley-Davidsons are "cool." Nor do they think that they can afford them. And, on top of all that, their dealers aren't lo-



cated in advantageous areas.

Will Harley-Davidson recover? Time will tell, but one thing is clear: your young neighbors won't be rolling into their driveways on choppers anytime soon.
