# **General Meeting Minutes...**

#### November 4, 2008

The meeting was called to order at 7:44 PM.

Guests were present and recognized at the meeting. Carl Marcyan introduced his brother who has been on rides with us before. Jim Hudmon, who has been a member since 2002, introduced his son Rick. Devon Smith was also a guest at the meeting.

Gary Brandt (President) announced that \$900 was raised by our recent trailer auction for NISRA. An additional \$250 was donated to NISRA by one of this year's raffle winners from the Ride for Dreams.

Thanks and appreciation was given by Gary in the form of a gift certificate to Terry Kumro and Cindy Raybern for spending their Sunday to pick up the donated trailer.

Chuck Prettyman, (Past President) announced and introduced the slate for the 2009 club officers and open position for director. The slate was produced with thought and deliberation by the election committee which is comprised of past club presidents. The candidates are Carl Marcyan for President, Mike Bradbury for Vice President, Tom Nichols for Treasurer, Joan DeRango of Secretary and Dennis Dougherty for Director. The Director positions are a 2 year term, so only one position has completed their 2nd year and needed to be filled. All candidates stood before the group and remarked on why they were running for their position. The election will be held at the December general meeting.

Eileen Perry (Membership Director) announced that Bill Lowry has been approved as a new member for Top Cats. He was presented his club flag, pin, and patch and was welcomed by the group to Top Cats.

Our membership has seen growth this year as this brings our total current membership to 104.

Wayne Kirkpatrick thanked everyone for their support who rode with Rolling Thunder, Chapter 2 of Illinois on October 16th on their Toys for Tots and Never Forget charity ride. The ride started this year at the V.A. Hospital in North Chicago. The ride grossed \$3800 which will help the veterans with daily reading material at the hospital.

Woodstock Harley Davidson is having free food and a "remembrance" table which honors veterans on Saturday, November 8th

The Top Cats will be having our annual banquet on January 24th, which is a Saturday night. It will be at the Millrose Restaurant in South Barrington. Arrangements are being made and the schedule will be confirmed shortly. The website will be updated with the final date on our schedule soon.

All road captains need to start thinking of what rides they want to lead in 2009 and inform Greg Smith, (Director of Activities) know what dates you want so he can get them reserved on the 2009 schedule.

Bard Boand, (Senior Road Captain) asked for all to consider and respond to joining on the Top Cats Sturgis ride. Last year we had 13 riders with only 4 riders from the Top Cats. He will pull the ride from the schedule if support is too low. Let Bard or Wayne Kirkpatrick know if you are interested in doing next year's ride.

Andy Konsewicz, (Director) is organizing a group to see the Trans Siberian Orchestra in concert at the Allstate Arena on January 3rd. Andy is buying the tickets one time at the Arena (sorry Ticketmaster) in about 30 days, so email him if you are interested. So far,

about 10 people are going.

Wayne Kirkpatrick, (Director of Safety) pointed out to the group that we are an example of safe group riding to local clubs. He gave us an example where the club's 2008 safety initiatives are being adopted by JerseyPines Cruisers. One initiative was no right turns on red lights. This keeps the group from breaking up. The other initiative was staying in the same lane if a rider leaves the group while riding in a staggered ride formation. You then move forward at the next stop. This keeps us from shifting lane to lane when someone drops out of the group.

Top Cats is always looking for members who are interested in becoming a road captain. If you want to create, plan, organize and lead a ride for the club, then become a road captain. If you are interested, see Don Schaffer.

Our Group Riding and Safety Seminar, or G.R.A.S.S. is this Sunday, November 9th. It is at the Village Bar and Grill in Buffalo Grove. The doors open at 8:00 AM, continental breakfast at 8:30 AM and G.R.A.S.S. will start at 9:00 AM. The annual Road Captains meeting will be held right afterwards at 12:00 PM.

Bard Boand presented the Safety Tips for the meeting. To do this, he enlisted the support of Ric Case and Larry Scalzatti. For the 1st safety tip, they demonstrated another way to have proper spacing in group riding. Provided riders have their mirrors adjusted properly, if you are spacing yourself properly which is 2 seconds behind the rider in your lane and 1 second from the rider on your oblique or other lane, then you should be able to see the rider's eyes in their mirrors. This is another way to keep proper spacing in your staggered positions while group riding.

## **General Meeting Continued...**

The 2nd safety tip is for riders to all make eye contact with other drivers at stops. If all riders make eye contact with the other traffic, it is easier for the group stay together.

At this point, new member Jeff Tietz presented his new company, City Scooter. He had a 49cc Cobra scooter at the meeting for us to see and test ride. This is a new

company that sells scooters from 49cc to 400cc models and accessories, including helmets for both scooters and motorcyclists.

The meeting was opened for comments from the floor. It was asked if we could have an Accident Scene Management course presented to the club. While there are several outlets for taking a course like this, we are looking into it and will know more

next spring.

Wayne knows of a detailer who will come to your house and detail your motorcycle for only \$80. See Wayne for more information.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:30 PM.

The board talked about possible new sites for G.R.A.S.S. The need to find a reliable meeting place was recognized. This is a matter that is left for the future board to consider and act on.

The updated club financials were reviewed. No concerns were expressed and the financial conditions were considered in a good state.

a company called Global Supply Chain. A motion was passed by the board to accept his application.

### **Safety Article**

Ready for Winter?

As the riding season comes to a close and we prepare our bikes for winter, have we considered what we as riders need to do as well to be ready for next spring?

Winter is the time for many to have engine, paint or accessory work performed on their motorcycle but winter is also the time to prepare yourselves for next season as well.

When was your last physical? Many of us still only see a doctor if they're feeling ill but regular visits to your doctor can help you to prevent future serious conditions.

Do you exercise and maintain a proper diet? Keeping yourself

physically fit is as important as maintaining your ride. Being limber and flexible helps your reaction time in emergency situations, cuts down on fatigue and makes adjusting your boots a heck of a lot easier!

How is your eyesight? As we mature, our eyes become weaker and the need for multi-vision eyewear may become a necessity. Don't let your pride prevent from wearing the eyewear that is required.

What shape is your riding gear in? Check your helmet for obvious signs of wear and age. Also, inspect jackets, pants, boots and gloves for fatigue and ripping. During a ride is not the time to find out your rain suit is split in half! Over the winter, various dealerships and bike shows will present the opportunity to upgrade or

replace your worn gear. A few hours to inspect and maintain your gear will go along way towards prepping yourself for next season.

A little more work is required to maintain your body however. Be it diet, exercise, physician consultations or something else; we owe it to ourselves, our family members and even fellow Top Cats to be in safe riding condition.

Taking care of yourself this offseason will help promote a better next-season!
