15 YEARS OF EXCELLENCE

Last year the board of directors decided to investigate the official date that the Top Cats were formed. There was some disagreement and confusion. After reviewing documents from that time period it was determined that officially, September 2nd 1995 was the correct date. KAUTION KORNER

I'm Perfectly Pine...

We at Top Cats believe in the freedom of choice. As adults we acknowledge the use of alcohol and prescriptive and/or over the counter drugs as legal in today's society but we still urge caution in their use.

Obviously, the levels for a DUI are known to all of us (.008 BAC), but do you know how much it takes to get there? When this topic was presented to me I recalled the general guidelines of 2 drinks/1st hour and 1 drink per hour after that. And do you know what? That is fine for a svelte metric rider like me but not for everyone. Example, with that formula a 200# male rider having 4 beers (drinks) in 3 hours would have a .028 BAC (Blood Alcohol Concentration) level. Not intoxicated but still exhibiting signs of mild euphoria, increased self-confidence and decreased inhibitions. Another male rider weighing in at only 140# and consuming the same amount in the same time frame would have a BAC of .065, though legal; still impaired. A female at the same 140# would be at .079 BAC and is right at the legal limit. Females have a different absorbance rate and therefore their alcohol BAC is typically about 25% higher.

The chart below references some typical scenarios. Please understand that a 12 oz Beer = 5 oz Wine= 1¼ oz Hard liquor.

When ingested, alcohol passes from the stomach into the small intestine, where it is rapidly absorbed into the blood and distributed throughout the body. Because it is distributed so quickly and thoroughly the alcohol can affect the central nervous system even in small concentrations. In low concentrations, alcohol reduces inhibitions. As blood alcohol concentration increases, a person's response to stimuli decreases markedly, speech becomes slurred, and he or she becomes unsteady and has trouble walking.

Now, this is not a class on how much you can get away with, but it's just to inform you how easy it is to get there. We are all adults here and we don't want to get into your personal choices...EXCEPT when it risks ours! As you can see, it doesn't take much to get intoxicated and these are only generalizations but still good guidelines. Many organizations have a zero-tolerance rule (you drink and you don't ride with us), though that rule is difficult to enforce, it's indicative of how organizations are trying to protect themselves both legally and more importantly, physically.

Prescriptive drugs: When used by themselves or when used with alcohol can often increase the effects of both. Understand the side effects before you operate any vehicle or mix with alcohol.



Fatigue: Though not discussed much, fatigue is just as deadly when you fall asleep or are no longer alert to other motorists on the roadway. Police departments can and will write a citation for impaired driving if your fatigue effects the operation of your vehicle. Citations for any of these and your insurance carrier will not be pleased.

If you don't care about yourself, then please care about your family members, your fellow Top Cats or that nice family that you are putting in harm's way just because you're too arrogant to heed caution or act responsibly.

We ask you to act and ride responsibly, not only when you're with the Top Cats, but at all times as well. If a member exhibits signs of altered behavior, their fellow Top Cats will assist them in securing their vehicle and arranging safe alternate transportation for them.

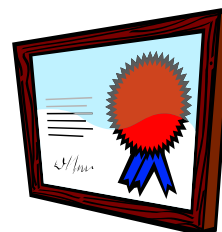
