

Did you know that most motorcycle accidents involve a short trip?

You could be going to go shopping or run errands and bang you find yourself in accident. A lot of our trips this time of year tend to short and we need to be especially careful.

Why do more accidents happen close to home?

The answer is simple, almost 72 per cent of respondents in an insurance survey admitted to paying less attention on local roads and 60 per cent said that they become lazy when nearing their home.

The most common crash within a mile of the home is crashing into parked cars. We tend to be on our comfort zone when we are on roads we know. When on long trips we tend to get sleep the night before and prepare for the trip. We are out of our comfort zone on long trips so we are constantly aware of what is going on around us. Some statistics say that only 89 per cent of accidents happen within 26 miles from the home. Keep in mind that the typical motorcycle accident allows you less than 2 seconds to complete all collision avoidance action. To keep yourself alert check your mirrors every five to eight seconds. Make sure you are constantly clearing the road ahead. On the residential streets, especially in winter look for cars because they will not be looking for you.

Keep your mind on the road at all times.

EPA TO DROP FOUR GALLON MINIMUM GAS PURCHASES

Ethanol-laden gasoline is known to cause engine damage, and many manufacturers warn that using the product will invalidate warranties, so when the EPA approved E15 (fuel blend containing 15% ethanol) it raised concerns amongst motorcyclists and others who use equipment driven by small gas-powered motors...none of which are approved for its use.

Watch Out For New Motorcycle Laws

that many states will have new motorcycle laws starting to go into effect. You need to know what laws will affect you. Here are some examples of new laws that states will start enforcing:

Illinois has at least 3 new laws including one where the Apparently realizing that a viable solution to the problem handlebars will have to be below the height of the rider's head. And any motorcyclist caught riding a 'wheelie' while they are exceeding the speed limit can expect a heftier fine. But this next one is a good one and should be adopted everywhere. After a "reasonable" amount of time waiting at a red light, the motorcycle will be able to proceed if there are no other oncoming cars. This law doesn't apply in cities of over 2 million people.

In California local governments are now prohibited from conducting motorcycle-only checkpoints.

And in Florida it is now legal to flash headlights at oncoming traffic to warn about police.

California enacts an un-sound exhaust law

Tampering Act went into effect. It gives police the authority to ticket motorcycles with non-compliant exhaust systems.

systems. Older bikes equipped with aftermarket systems purchased before Jan. 1, 2013, are not affected.

An older bike that has a non-compliant aftermarket exhaust installed or purchased after the 1/1/13 deadline would also be in violation of the law.

100 dBA for motorcycles with three or four cylinders at 5,000 rpm

While SB435 is now in place, the MIC along with the rest of the industry is working to get the State of California, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) and EPA to adopt J2825.
