KAUTION KORNER

Can a Date Change Your Day? By: Greg Smith, Senior Road Captain



As we plan a ride or trip, we get our bikes mechanically ready to ride, make sure have the proper riding apparel to wear, and engage in a thorough and in depth trip planning process, but with all these precautions and planning, we often forget the simplest little thing, and maybe the most important.

Before I let the cat out of the bag and tell you what it is, I want to tell you a true story that happened on one of our Top Cat rides to one of the riders. If you were with us on this ride, you will remember.

It was about five years ago and I was the Road Captain leading a group on a day ride through the Galena Territory. We were on the return side of the ride and were about 4 miles outside of Mount Carroll. The 2-spot rider of the group suddenly had a bee fly up into his T-shirt sleeve and stung him. The rider, knowing he was allergic to bees as a child, quickly motioned for an emergency stop. Since we were on a country road with little traffic, it was easy to pull everyone over immediately. After finding out what happened several of us pulled out our first aid kits and desperately looked for some Benadryl, but we all came up empty. The rider indicated he was okay to ride so we mounted up and road the 4 miles into Mount Carroll where we stopped at the only gas station open, but unfortunately they had no Benadryl. I made one last attempt to help him out and dumped my first aid kit out on my seat. I thought for sure I had some. Good news was I found some! Two sealed packs of Benadryl with two tablets in each pack. Bad news was the expiration date was two years past. The rider decided to take the outdated Benadryl anyways and fortunately was fine for the rest of the trip. However, things could have gone the other way.

We all learned a surprising lesson that day - one that I'm sure has stuck with all of us that were on that ride. Don't forget the simplest little thing and maybe the most important part of your bike, your First Aid Kit, and the importance of keeping it Up-To-Date. Inspect your kits at the beginning of every riding season since medications not only expire, but adhesives can dry out.




You would think that buying a first aid kit would be simple, but there are many different kinds of premade kits designed for different situations. If you want control over what's included in your first aid kit, making your own is the way to go. Important items to remember for your kit include bandages, gauze pads and tape, antibiotic ointment, tweezers, scissors, pain relievers like ibuprofen, and antihistamines, Black Talon® Gloves, and 4x4 Water-Jel® Burn Dressings, to mention a few, and don't forget the Benadry!

I was once told by a fellow Top Cat to be sure to keep your kit full and up-to-date because if something happened to you, your fellow riders might grab your kit and use it on you!

As road captains, we usually ask during the pre-ride discussion, who has a first aid kit? Perhaps we should reword this and ask who has an up-to-date first aid kit? Do you?





Ride to Work Day was inspired by "Work to Ride -Ride to Work'" marketing materials created between 1989 and 1991 by the Aero Design and Manufacturing Company, a Minnesota based manufacturer of motorcycle riders clothing. In 1992 these items inspired motorcycle magazine editor Fred Rau to write an editorial calling for a national ride to work day.

The first annual Ride to Work Day event was proposed in Road Rider magazine (now titled Motorcycle Consumer News) in the May 1992 issue. This is an excerpt from that "Ride to Work" editorial: "You may remember several months ago when Bob Carpenter, commenting in his 'Two Up' column, mentioned how neat he thought it would be if there was one day a year when everyone who owned a motorcycle used it to ride to work. That comment was prompted by a Tshirt produced by Aerostich RiderWear that simply said, 'Work To Ride, Ride To Work.' Everyone seemed to think that a national 'Ride To Work' day was one heck of a good idea."


The first Ride to Work Day event date was July 22nd, 1992. For several years various motorcycle businesses (Continued on page 7) informally promoted every third Wednesday in July as Ride To Work Day. These early advocates included Road Rider Magazine, Dunlop Tires, and Aerostich Riderwearhouse. The event continued to grow as an informal grass roots demonstration every year until 2000. That year a non-profit organization, Ride to



Work was formed to help organize and promote Ride tions and all walks of to Work Day. The first Ride to Work Day event led by this group was the third Wednesday in July of 2001. This day was the annual day until 2008, when it was changed to the Third Monday in June. This change was made to climatically better accommodate riders world-wide, and to give more riders an opporparticipate. to

Ride to Work is a 501 c4 nonprofit, all-volunteer effort. Organizers include Andy Goldfine, Lynn Wisneski and Christine Holt.

HD Screamin' Eagle Drag Team **Stavs Undefeated**



The Harley-Davidson Screamin' Eagle/Vance & Hines team remains undefeated on the 2016 NHRA Mello Yello Drag Racing Series as rider Ed Krawiec won the Pro Stock Motorcycle final at the Summit Racing Equipment NHRA Southern Nationals in Atlanta. Krawiec rode a Harley-Davidson V-Rod motorcycle to his second win of the season and the team's third in a row for the season.

"The weather cooled down and we had great V-Rod conditions on Sunday," said Krawiec, who has now won 33 times in final-round appearances. "We had a good tune-up since Saturday, so we were focused on making chassis adjustments to keep the bike running as straight as possible down the track. This class is so tight right now making a clean run is essential to winning."

After three of 16 Pro Stock Motorcycle events on the 2016 NHRA Mello Yello Drag Racing Series, Krawiec leads the class with 353 points. Harley-Davidson Screamin' Eagle/Vance & Hines rider Andrew Hines holds down second place with 233 points. Hines rode his Harley-Davidson V-Rod to a win at the NHRA Four-Wide Nationals in Char- launch and grand finale in Brooklyn and San Francislotte, N.C. on April 24.

Krawiec was the number-two qualifier for the Atlanta race with a best elapsed time of 6.880 seconds on Saturday. Krawiec had his best run of the weekend in the final, a 6.824-second blast that outpaced the 6.851 effort of runner-up Jerry Savoie. Krawiec and Hines race on Harley-Davidson Night Rod Specials, motorcycles powered by a liquidcooled 60° V-twin engine.

The Harley-Davidson Screamin' Eagle/Vance & Hines drag racing team returns to action June 10-12 at the 47th annual NHRA Summernationals at Old Bridge Township Raceway Park in Englishtown, N.J.

SISTERS' CENTENNIAL MOTORCYCLE RIDE



2016 is the 100th anniversary of Augusta and Adeline Van Buren's courageous and unprecedented ride across the United States on motorcycles. The Sisters' Centennial Motorcycle Ride July 3-23, 2016, will honor and celebrate our female motorcycling heroines of the past, as we promote the growth of women motorcyclists and the motorcycling community.

In 1916 the Van Buren Sisters were the first women to cross the continental United States, each on her own motorcycle. They became the first women to reach the 14,115 foot summit of Pikes Peak each on her own motorcycle. In 2002 the Sisters were inducted into the American Motorcyclists Association Hall of Fame and in 2003 they were inducted into the Sturgis Motorcycle Museum & Hall of Fame.

Women, as well as men, are encouraged to come out and meet the riders along the way at community events posted on the website.

Honda issues Gold Wing recall



Honda (American Honda Motor, Inc.) has issued a recall for 2,701 motorcycles when it was found that the air bag inflator may rupture. An inflator rupture may result in metal fragments striking the rider, resulting in serious injury or death.

The recall affects certain model year 2006-2010 Honda GL1800 (Gold Wing) motorcycles manufactured February 8, 2006, to May 14, 2009 originally sold, or ever registered, in Alabama, California, Florida, Georgia, Hawaii, Louisiana, Mississippi, South Carolina, Texas, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Guam, the Northern Mariana Islands (Saipan), and the U.S. Virgin Islands, or "Zone A." Additionally, unless included in "Zone A" above, Honda is recalling certain model year 2006-2008 Honda GL 1800 (Gold Wing) motorcycles manufactured May 10, 2007, to May 14, 2009 originally sold, or ever registered, in Arizona, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Columbia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Missouri, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New Mexico, North Carolina, Ohio, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee, Virginia, and West Virginia, or "Zone B."

Motorcycles not originally sold or ever registered in either Zones A or B are not subject to this safety recall. These motorcycles are equipped with an air bag inflator assembled as part of the air bag module, used as original equipment or replacement equipment. In the event of a crash necessitating deployment of the air bag, these inflators may rupture due to propellant degradation occurring after long-term exposure to absolute humidity and temperature cycling.

Honda will notify owners, and dealers will replace the air bag module containing the inflator, free of charge. The manufacturer has not yet provided a notification schedule. Owners may contact Honda customer service at 1-866-784-1870. Honda's number for this recall is KA8.



Past President's Report: Wayne Kirkpatrick


Wayne encouraged all members to Solicit Members to participate in the club's charity event!

50 / 50 Raffle was won by Bob Stevenson! Meeting adjourned at 9:05






