

What are the Causes of Accidents? Read the Stats and Learn! By: Jim Purcell, Road Captain



article posted by UCLA and National Traffic 🔺 Highway Safety Administration study on motorcycles and found some interesting information. The study looked at over 3600 accidents

on west coast.

They found that three fourths of all accidents were involved with vehicles and that only a quarter with fixed objects or running off the road.

Check out these stats:

- Vehicle failure accounted for less than 3% of these
- Roadway defects (pavement ridges, potholes, etc.) were the accident cause in 2% of the accidents.
- Animal involvement was 1% of the accidents.
- Intersections are the most likely place for the motorcycle accident, with the other vehicle violating the motorcycle right-of-way, and often violating traffic controls. And other vehicles turning left in front of the motorcycle was the leading cause of intersection accidents
- You would think that weather would be a contributing factor but in 98% of accidents, it was not.
- The majority of accidents were only a short distance from origin of trip. Usually 3 to 5 miles from home
- The median pre-crash speed was 29.8 mph, and the median crash speed was 21.5 mph, and the one-in-athousand crash speed is approximately 86 mph.

- The motorcycle riders involved in accidents are essentially without training; 92% were self-taught or learned from family or friends.

- I recently read an + More than half of the accident-involved motorcycle riders had less than 5 months experience on the accident motorcycle,
 - The study even included colors of motorcycles and types (touring, cruisers, full dressers) and showed the higher percentage in café racers and so called crotch rockets. (Read sites below for details.)
 - Seventy-three percent of the accidents involved motorcycle riders used no eye protection, and it is likely that the wind on the unprotected eyes contributed in impairment of vision which delayed hazard detection.
 - Sixty percent of the motorcyclists were not wearing safety helmets at the time of the accident. That attributed to fatal injures
 - Age and experience make you a safer rider, although experts disagree on which factor is more important.
 - And finally the most interesting fact is that Less than 10% of the motorcycle riders involved in these accidents had insurance of any kind to provide medical care or replace property.

Read those carefully and you will find the reasons why our club requires that we take GRASS Classes, and why we talk so frequently about our need to wear helmets, boots and gloves, and do safety check on our bikes on a regular basis. When riding together, we proceed cautiously into intersections; pass with great care and clear the road ahead. It may be frustrating at times, but these are important safety strategies! Patience = a safe ride!


We also identify lane position as an important avoidance technique and it is vital when braking in some situations. Basically, you should move yourself away from any potential threats before they violate your right-of-way.

Get out and practice those evasive techniques: braking Almost half of the fatal accidents show alcohol in- swerving, staying in the right gear for maximum accelera-All of these tips can be used each time you ride. tion. Every ride is a learning experience and we should never stop learning. It will keep us safe, alert, and increase our ability to judge situations accurately. As we always say... It never hurts to be safe!





Unlike the Scout, or the even lower Bobber, we're expecting

the FTR to have a high-spec inverted fork up front and an adjustable monoshock rear, both tuned for road use. We'd also expect it to have an 18in rear and 19in front wheel to give an authentic looking flat-track stance.

Indian isn't the first US brand to target Europe with a Vtwin flat- tracker. Harley-Davidson released the XR1200 in 2008 and the fancy XR1200X but sales never took off.

Indian will be hoping that the current appetite for flat-track and scramblers will prove a perfect storm for their FTR1200.

Annually we have the opportunity to either vote to confirm a slate or to choose candidates for our Board of Directors and our Executive Committee for the coming year. Annually, we verify our members who are eligible to vote and who are eligible to run for office based on Club participation, dues, GRASS attendance, committee service, etc, consistent with our Bylaws.



As we approach this key, and critical, Club event all of us should be reminded of the impact of our vote....

Ideally, with our vote we are continuing the great legacy of Top Cats – Illinois into our 23d year and selecting the best possible candidates to run our Club consistent with our By Laws. Ideally, each of us will cast our vote to select or confirm candidates based on their proven performance, dedication, and contributions to the Club. Ideally, our selections will not be based on personal friendships alone, animosity, or in retaliation toward the Club, its leadership, or its members.

When you find yourself faced with a selection decision, simply look at your choices and determine 1.) Who has the best interest of the Club at heart, 2.) Who has a proven record of dedication to the Club, 3.) Who has the experience for that particular position and, 4.) If all else is a tie, ask yourself who you see at every ride, every meeting, every committee activity, every Club event, and every charity ride. That should help you decide.

<u>NOMINATIONS</u>. We have a wealth of eligible candidates this year and we are very fortunate to have each incumbent accept a nomination for another term. The positions up for election / reelection this year are:

President Vice President Three Directors

Eligibility for nomination includes; dues paid, attend a combination of 5 meetings/events per year, GRASS attended within the last 3 years, service on the Board or on a committee. We ask that nominations be received by a serving Board member by **12 November 2018.**

Please be cautious of candidates who violate Club policy of no campaigning or who try to influence voting. That kind of lack of integrity will only result in a negative impact on one of the finest Clubs in this area....Top Cats – Illinois.



<u>VOTING</u>. To be eligible to vote at the 4 December general meeting...each Top Cat must have been a member in good standing for one year, attend GRASS within the first year of membership and within the past three years thereafter, and attend a combination of 5 meetings/events per year.

The Board can waive certain requirements on an individual basis for unforeseen hardships or circumstances.

- Kaution Korner To Pee or Not to Pee... A Great Question addressed by Greg Smith in this month's KK. A lively discussion by the membership addressed the variables that can affect a body's need to 'relieve'. Bottom line was that you have to get to know your body and what levels you need to stay hydrate, but to also be able to travel without needing to stop the group because of over-consumption. Take time to understand what you need... and read the entire article. It is a good source of information and a good start to 'getting off the pot'.

MCRIDER Breaking Video:

• MCrider releases a weekly video every Tuesday morning on the subject of motorcycle control and strategy. MCrider videos and the associated web site is produced by Kevin Morris, a professional motorcycle instructor located in Dallas / Ft Worth, TX. He brings good information, but you are reminded that you are responsible for your own safety, please train responsibly.



- This month's video focused on the ability to break quickly in emergency situations. A story was told about a lady who was coming over a hill and came upon a truck that was making a turn. Her breaking practice came in handy and she managed the situation successfully.
- Discussion after the video included the need to recognize that breaking strategies depend on the breaking system that you have on your bike. Older models, as was the case in the video, require care in applying the front breaks. The strategy is to apply the rear breaks hard, and then squeeze the front breaks in order to maintain control of the stop. BUT... if you have ABS breaks, apply both front and back breaks equally hard! In most newer models, the breaks are linked so making a quick stop is done whether you grab front or back breaks.... So grab or stomp those breaks quickly. The bike automatically applies front and rear with equal pressure.
- All agreed that these videos are worth the time and that they generate constructive discussion!




